Important Instructions For the Students

It is mandatory for each and every student seeking admission to this college, to abide by the rules in order to uphold peace, discipline and educational atmosphere in the college premises. Necessary actions will be taken against the student who are found guilty of flouting the rules. The rules are as under:

Instructions about admission:

- i. Admission only through admission committee will be considered valid, Admission sought through any other means will stand cancelled.
- ii. It is binding for the students to present along with necessary documents in person at the time of admission. Any relative, friends or any other person will not be permitted to seek the admission.
- iii. All the scholarship holder students are instructed to open an account with a nationalized bank otherwise their admission will not be confirmed.
- iv. Please write the account number and name of the bank on the admission form.
- v. The students are permitted to choose either Marathi or Hindi Medium for admission.
- vi. The classes Time from 7.15 a.m. to 10.25 a.m.

Other Important Instructions:

- i. The students can not enter the college premises without Identity Card.
- ii. The students who is regularly absent in the class his/ her admission will be cancelled without any prior notice.
- iii. Strict will be taken against the student who is found guilty with insolent behaviour with teachers or involved in some impertinent activities with other students.
- iv. Smoking, Tobacco, Ghutka, Pan etc. prohibited in the college premises.
- v. The Students are instructed to keep their vehicles only at the directed places.
- vi. Students having any quarry/problem/complaint can contact the "Grievance Redresser Cell".
- vii. The students should use the college furniture, electricity, equipments carefully. The students who sabotage the college property will be liable to punishment.
- viii. The students are not allowed to sit in the classrooms other than their own class without prior permission of the concerned teacher. They can not bring the outside students into the college premises.
- ix. Principal permission is necessary before giving any information about the college to any news- paper.
- x. No committee or council can be formed and no outsider can be invited without permission of the principal or vice-principal.
- xi. It is obligatory for the students to abide by the rules and regulations as and when formed by the principal.

- xiii. The students are instructed to take the Principal's signature on the Identity Card within the 15 days from the admission date otherwise Rs. 100/- will be fined from the students.
