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1. INTRODUCTION

Dr. Madhukarrao Wasnik PWS Arts and Commerce College is one of the oldest institution in the central India established in 1968. During the current session college has two major streams i.e. Arts and Commerce running two under graduate courses and 10 PG courses. The college is an approved center for higher learning for Ph. D study by RTM Nagpur University, Nagpur. In the current session 2020-21 some 2282 students are enrolled for all the course in senior college level.

In a very unprecedented time when college was running under online mode completely due to Covid 19 Lockdown. When students were stranded in their places many of them are from remote region where there was no facilities for online access due to network issues. The session begins in the first wave of Covid 19 and closed under second wave. In the light of lockdown situation from the closure of previous session college had already come out with the online solutions for students. From March itself teachers started completing their syllabus via online platform like google meet, Zoom, WebEx, and Skype. Also to create a permanent repository of study material on college official website for those who missed the online lectures can access them any time. Besides college teachers under the guidance of IQAC, come with a novel solution by creating two YouTube channels for students as well as teachers. The first channel is PWS Teachers' (Official) where teachers deposits their live lectures for students which could be used by any students under RTM Nagpur University. Another Channel is DMWPWS Webinar, which is created for live webinar for online participants. On the other hand the deposit lecture and webinars help students listen to the faculties of national repute.

The examinations were conducted online where students solved their examination on their mobile, many of them were unable to solve their exam due to network issues. Thanks to teachers who helped students and guided them in such circumstances. Teachers created WhatsApp group for students class wise and through which every information related lecture, study material and examination was passed on to students. All information related examination was given on college website so that students may remain in touch with the development happened in the college as well University affairs in the session.

The lockdown period was totally used for maximum gain by using ICT. College teachers regularly attended many subject based webinars and faculty development Programme which was conducted by UGC HRDSCs in different universities in the country. Such programme helped teachers update their teaching skills and at the same time learned techniques to handle different online tools to engage online classes for their teachers.

While all department were engaged in the online teaching learning different committees were working in developing college activities for students to enhance their engagement in cultural, extension and personality development activities. NSS wing done an outstanding works during the lockdown where 6 college teacher with around 10 NSS volunteers worked as Covid Yodhya and worked with Kapil Nagar Police station and NMC to help creating Covid 19 awareness among the people in the neighboring colonies. Cultural committee organized quiz and essay competition online for students. Extension cell distributed masks and sanitizers to neighboring colonies. NSS and extension cell also started Covid 19 tests drive in the college as well as in the neighboring colonies.

In the lockdown situation when college was functioning online, many repair works was done. Since college was about to start the Science wing in the coming session the current session was utilized for the infrastructure development on the third floor.

We would like to appreciate all efforts by the teachers to face the unprecedented situation bravely and come out with the creative online solutions. The outcome of the session was brilliant when we have created two YouTube channel and used college official website creatively yet highly productive way. Thanks to all students who faced tremendous difficulties in coping with the online mode of teaching yet cooperated college and teachers by patience and tolerance with the situation. The non-teaching staff was equally involved in the online way of works and competed all admin works systematically. The time was a learning experience and we all navigated through well. Appreciation to the chairman of the society Dr. Madhukarraoji Wanik who would always chaired the online webinar and enjoyed the sessions. Thanks to all Management members for their support and cooperation during the session. Thank You.

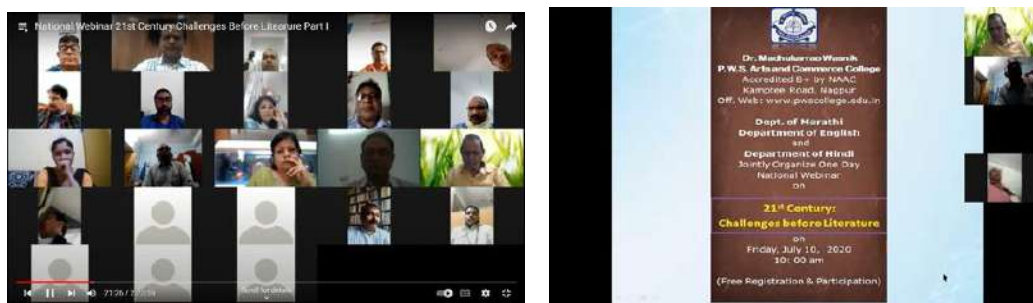


4. Movie “Jhund” under the banner of Film Club:

Workshop on University Examination was organized on March 21, 2021. The Chief Guest was Dr. Sudesh Bhowate, Head, Dept of English.



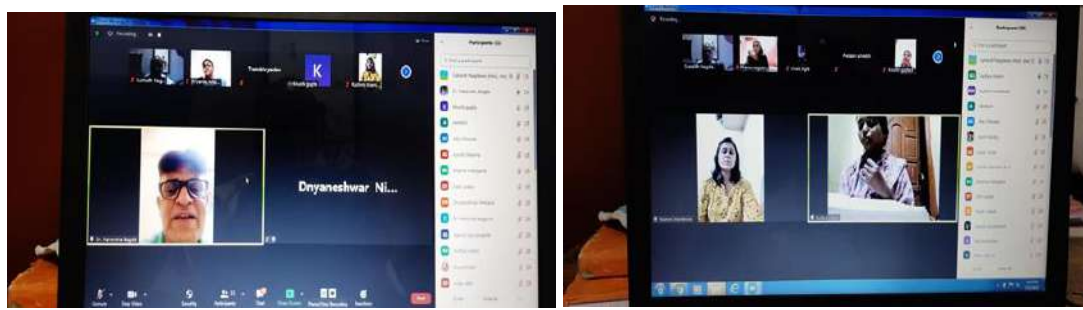

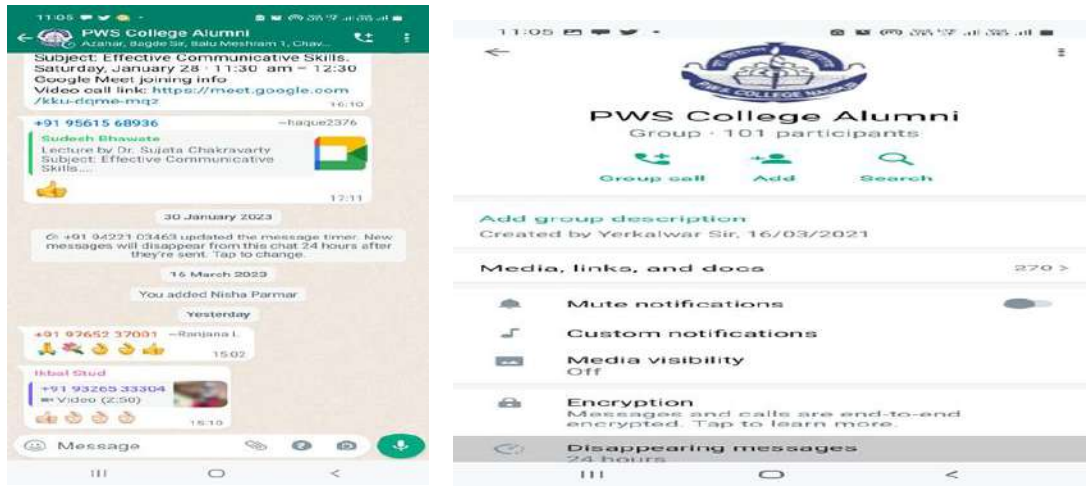

To observe “Hindi Day” an essay competition on “The relevance of Gandhism” and “Digital India” on 14/09/20. 42 Students participated and submitted their articles.



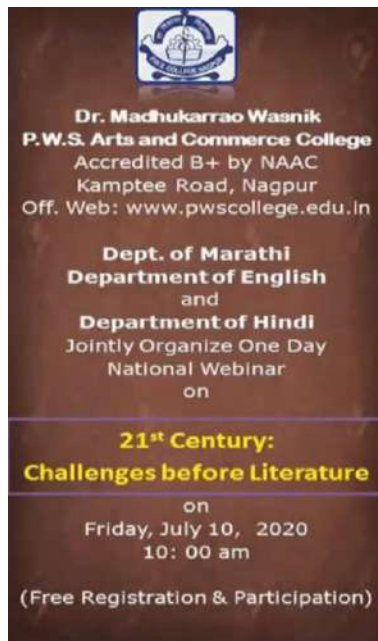

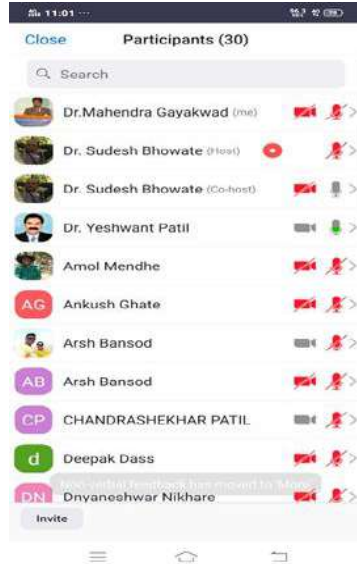
3. Two Day National Webinar

After successful completion of this course, the Valedictory Function was held on the 31st of January, 2020 with Principal Dr. Yeshwant Patil as the chairperson and Dr. Manish Vyas of V.M.V. College, Nagpur as the chief guest. National Service Scheme (NSS)

A Public Awareness Campaign about Covid-19 {From 1st Sept. to 4th Sept. 2020}

From the 1st of September to the 4th of September-2020, a useful 'Public Health Awareness Campaign' concerning the outbreak of Covid-19 was taken up by the NSS unit of the college in the nearby residential localities of Aawalebabu- Nagar, Siddharth Nagar and Shende Nagar. This constructive programme involved officers and 20 volunteer students of the college NSS unit.

These 20 volunteers made door-to-door visits to 200 houses in these localities and distributed informative health-related brochures to a number of families. Some people were leading extremely stressful lives. Distribution of Kitchen-kits by NSS

(20th Sept. 2020)

During the period of lockdown, a number of families became disadvantaged and were passing through financial crises and consequent anxieties. Our members of the college 'teaching fraternity' had already given the necessary financial help to the NSS department. 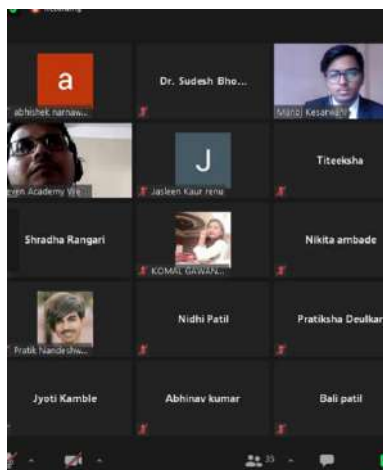
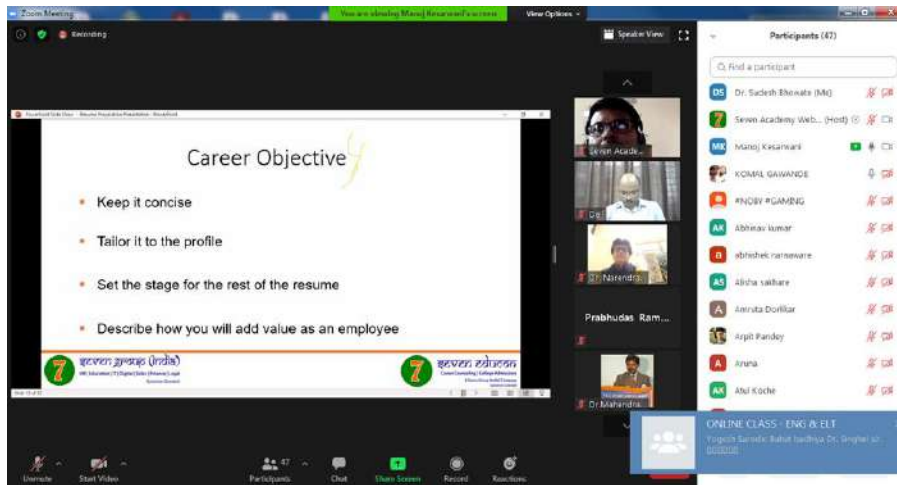

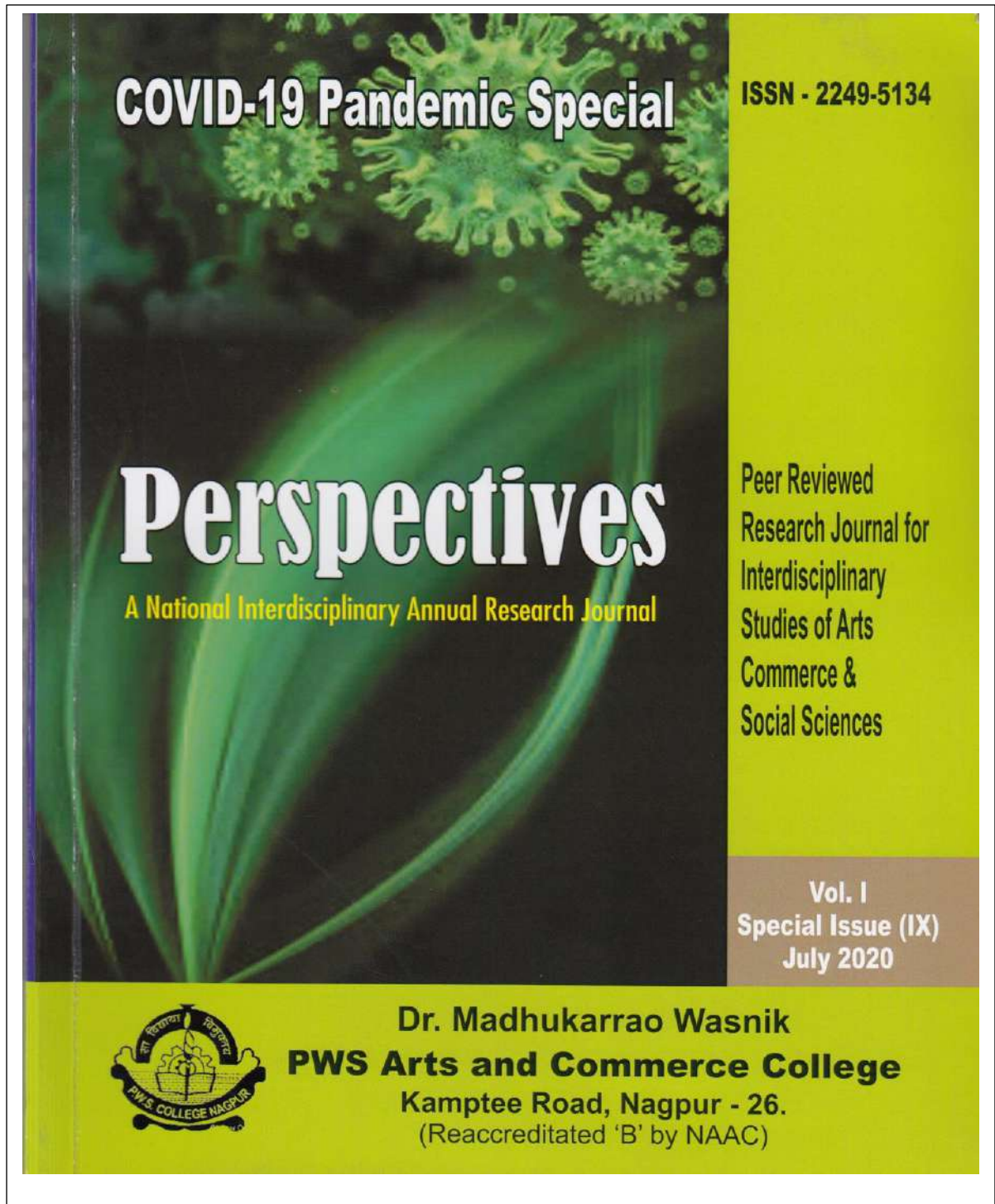
Interview Skills and Resume Preparation conducted on 10 June 2021

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8. IQAC ACTIVITIES

Significant Contribution made by IQAC in the session 2020-21

1. The session 21 was entirely affected of Covid 19 Pandemic. Teaching learning was online. But since students stranded at their home places quite away from college, due to network issues they were not able to join regular classes. Students had no facilities of even phones. Therefore, we wanted to come up with the permanent solution to provide at least study material to students. IQAC took initiatives to start uploading UG & PG study material (downloadable) to college official website with the help of Website committee.

2. WhatsApp group of each section/ semester-wise courses formed to update students about class schedule, examination schedules, etc. A menu of Examination was put up on College Official website. Through notices each and every development was communicated to students on college website.

3. Online Webinar for teaching community in different subjects including WIPR were conducted in June and July 2020.

4. In the light of Works in to Sensitizing gender issues and recognizing Lifelong works of women social workers and writers, IQAC suggested Women cell to introduce Savitribai Phule Jiwan Gaurav Puraskar (Life Time Achievement Award). The Women cell, IQAC conducted with principal and decided to introduce the said Award and on its first Award was decided to confer upon Noted Writer and Social Worker Smt. Kuumud Pawade. Also it was decided to confer the award in the National Webinar on “Status of Women in Higher Education in India: Redefining Roles” 4th January 2021. The award was given in the presence of Dr. Vimal Thorat.

5. To facilitate online resource material for students and to develop permanent video Tutorial on college Website, IQAC suggested college teachers to conduct online lecture series on the semester syllabus in collaboration with the colleges under MoU/Linkages. Some departments took initiatives in that direction which are as follows:

Internal Academic Audit Report (2020-2021)

Under the guidance of Hon Principal and college IQAC Coordinator, Internal Academic Audit committee evaluated the works of College departments, Committees and administrations sections on the basis of the reports, Dept. files, and Teachers profile submitted by the concerned HoDs, Committee Conveners and faculty members. Evaluation of Admin record was done by personal visits to the respective sections. This process was initiated keeping in mind the improvement of Academic Standards of the Institution and overall development of the students by facilitating apt support. Report also helps us to locate our weaknesses in record keeping

The internal Academic Audit was conducted in the month of April 2021. A special format "Teachers Profile" designed to measure the overall involvement and performance of the teaching faculty in the terms of academic upgradation of academic and professional competence. These forms were distributed to all the teachers in each department existing in the institution. Teachers submits their teachers' profile directly to college NAAC coordinator. Through this process and interaction, the various lapses and lacunas in infrastructural and academic grounds were pointed out. The faculty members who have not shown interest to engage in Ph. D. Research or publication of sufficient Research papers were advised to do so at the earliest. Teachers were also advised to participate in Faculty Development Programmed conducted by UGC HRDC for upgrading ICT knowledge.

The Committee members visited personally each department and took a review of departmental files and documentations.

Various issues confronted by the faculty were discussed in detail and proper solutions were suggested on them by the committee. During this visit many drawbacks were traced, analyzed and rectified by the HoDs with the help of faculty members in the department.

Within two weeks all the departments were scrutinized and the evaluation process was completed. A healthy discussion was taken up to involve all the faculties and were made aware of the benefits of this whole process.

The Internal Audit Report for Degree Course Departments in Arts & Commerce as well as ten PG Departments was prepared by the Committee. The Committee convened different meetings with the teaching staff to bring about the improvement in the teaching learning experience and to make it more fun loving and enriching for the students.

Since the entire session was conducted online, college has already taken initiatives by uploading study material to college website for students' access. Also Two YouTube Channels PWS Teachers (Official) and DMWPWS Webinar were launched for Live sessions and Video Tutorials. Teachers were guided for the same and they were asked to submit online material and video tutorial to the web repositories. Also all the departments were advised to enhance their vibrant involvement in college teaching learning process under the Covid 19 Pandemic restrictions.

Since the examinations were conducted online by University, teachers were already instructed by the college principal to circulate examination information on various students' WhatsApp groups. Every department was oriented about online examination works during academic audit visit.

A visit was paid to administrations sections including admission section, scholarship section, account section, External exam section, and Library. The record of all admin sections were verified and wherever necessary they were asked to update the record. Weaknesses of the record keeping was brought to their light and same was informed to the principal.


The committee reports were submitted to college IQAC were examined by the Internal Audit committee. The weaknesses were pointed out and conveyed to the concerned committee conveners.

Since the college IQAC Coordinator and Co-coordinators were the part of the Internal Audit Committee, various lacunas were noted down and decided to overcome all those issues in the following session. The report is submitted to the Principal for the further appropriate action.




