Institutional Initiatives for Electoral Literacy

1. "Voter Awareness Week" (July 15 to July 30, 2017)

Dr. Madhukarrao Wasnik College of Arts, Commerce, and Science, under the Department of Political Science, organized the "Voter Awareness Week" from July 15 to July 30, 2017. As per the instructions of the District Election Office, Nagpur, the college conducted this program to register new students who would be eligible to vote during the 2017-2018 academic session. The program included filling out voter registration forms for the newly admitted students. Dr. R.P. Gan, the college principal, presided over the event, and election officials from the District Election Office, including Dr. Pradnya Bagde, Vice-Principal, and Vimal Rathod, Head of the Department, were present. The complete report of the program was submitted to the District Election Office in Nagpur.

2. VVPAT Voter Awareness Program (March 8, 2019)

India is a democracy where the people hold the supreme power. The Indian Constitution has granted the right to vote to its citizens. This has brought significant changes to the lives of Indian people. Over the years, the machinery of democracy in India has evolved. Therefore, the traditional method of voting, where voters would mark their choices on a ballot paper and put it in a ballot box, became cumbersome and time-consuming. To modernize the voting process, the Election Commission of India introduced Electronic Voting Machines (EVMs) for elections across the country over the past three decades.

However, using these machines has also introduced a new challenge – ensuring the integrity of the election process and eliminating discrepancies. These electronic machines have been a subject of debate and controversy in Indian politics and among Indian citizens. To address this issue, the Election Commission of India embarked on a journey to find a middle path. This led to the introduction of Voter Verified Paper Audit Trail (VVPAT) machines, which allow voters to verify their vote before it is cast.

With VVPAT machines, when a voter presses the button on the electronic voting machine for their chosen candidate, a paper slip with the candidate's name, photo, and election symbol is printed. The slip is displayed to the voter for about seven seconds for verification. This ensures that the voter can verify whether their vote has been registered correctly. This step enhances transparency and gives voters confidence that their vote has been counted accurately.





To raise awareness about VVPAT and educate the students, the Department of Political Science organized a Voter Awareness Program in collaboration with the District Election Office, Nagpur. Officials from the Election Office demonstrated how VVPAT machines work, how

votes are cast using electronic machines, and how to verify votes using VVPAT. The program was attended by approximately 100 students from the college.

This initiative, led by the Head of the Department of Political Science, Vimal Rathod, and Dr. Sushant Chimankar, aimed to familiarize students with the modern voting process and the importance of VVPAT in ensuring fair and transparent elections.

3. National Voter's Day - January 25, 2021

In India, citizens who have reached the age of 18 have the right to vote, as granted by the Indian Constitution. India conducts a general election every five years, spanning from local self-government elections to parliamentary elections. However, many Indian citizens are still not fully aware of the importance of voting. To address this, the Government of India has initiated various programs to raise awareness about voting, with National Voter's Day being observed on January 25 every year.



The Department of Political Science organized National Voter's Day, where activities such as voter ID verification were conducted in areas like Tekanaka, Shende Nagar, and Avale Babu Nagar. Dr. Vimal Rathod, the Head of the Political Science Department, delivered a guiding speech during the program. In his address, he emphasized that voting is not just a right but also a duty as a part of one's service to the nation. He explained that a strong and active democracy is essential for the various facets of a nation's development, and active participation in the voting process contributes to the progress of the country. Therefore, every citizen should consider exercising their right to vote as a crucial responsibility.





This program, coordinated by Dr. Sushant Chimankar, aimed to engage approximately 150 citizens in the process of voter ID verification and raise awareness about the importance of voting as a cornerstone of democracy.

4. National Voter's Day Awareness Program (July 14, 2021)

Dr. Madhukarrao Wasnik College of Arts, Commerce, and Science, under the Department of Political Science and the National Service Scheme (NSS), jointly organized an awareness program on the subject of voting to increase voter awareness and promote voter participation. The program featured Dr. Sushant Chimankar as the keynote speaker.

Dr. Sushant Chimankar's speech emphasized the declining trend of voter turnout and the need for increased voter awareness. He stressed the importance of raising awareness among women and ensuring that they are well-informed about their rights and responsibilities related to voting.

Dr. Vimal Rathod, the Head of the Political Science Department, presided over the program. He emphasized the need to build awareness among voters, increase voter turnout, and enhance the understanding of rights and responsibilities in a democracy to make it successful

6. State Level Seminar on

"Indian Democracy and Voter's Behaviour" (April 7, 2022)

Dr. Madhukarrao Wasnik College of Arts, Commerce, and Science, Nagpur, in collaboration with the Department of Political Science and the B.L. Bhole, Study Circle, organized a one-day intercollegiate state-level seminar on the topic of "Indian Democracy and Voter behaviour" on April 7, 2022.
